You will be encouraged to be an active, contributing member of an interprofessional healthcare team, which will give you the opportunity to study with different nursing and medical specialists in a range of specialized fields.

You will gain strong, practical skills by completing a minimum of 1200 hours of clinical placements in hospitals, private clinics and community health settings.
